



FOREWORD

We are delighted to present the Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Report for the fiscal year 2022-23, showcasing the impactful endeavours of leading foreign investors operating in Pakistan. These initiatives stand as a cornerstone in bolstering the socio-economic fabric of local communities. In the past year, the collective efforts of our members have resulted in a commendable contribution of nearly PKR 13 billion (compared to PKR 12 billion in 2020-2021), directly benefiting over 40 million individuals nationwide.

Following the recommendations of OICCI's CSR core team, the 2023 CSR report format has been revamped to align foreign investors' social contributions according to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Collaborating with over 290 social sector organizations, our members' CSR initiatives span to the four provinces of Pakistan as well as to Azad Kashmir, and Gilgit-Baltistan. However, as before about two-thirds of our members CSR activities were concentrated in Sindh and Punjab province.

While our members' contributions span across all 17 SDGs, a notable portion of these efforts has been specifically directed towards Quality Education (SDG 4), Affordable and Clean Energy (SDG 7), Decent Work and Economic Growth (SDG 8), and Life on Land (SDG 15). This focused approach underscores our members commitment to initiating positive change and sustainable development in Pakistan, guided by the principles of responsible corporate citizenship.

According to UNICEF estimates, approximately 23 million children in Pakistan are out-of-school. representing 44% of the total population in the 5-16 age group - the second-highest number globally. Our members' have duly recognised the need to fill this gap and made a generous contribution of PKR 2.3 billion in 2023 alone towards SDG 4 in supporting the education and skill development of vulnerable children in society, in collaboration with organizations such as The Citizen Foundation. Akhuwat Foundation, STEM Pakistan, SOS Village, and public sector schools.

Furthermore, our members exemplary actions towards SDG 7, 8, and 15, with a contribution of PKR 2.2 billion, PKR 2.6 billion and PKR 2.1 billion. respectively, covered many key activities including providing solar panels to farmers and flood-affected communities, vocational training, tree plantation, and effective waste management skills, thereby actively contributing towards a better work environment and surroundings. The attached report also highight various initiatives towards empowerment of marginalized segments of society so as to integrate them as valuable partners in the economic development of the country.

Overseas Investors Chamber of Commerce and Industry (OICCI) members continue to make positive contributions to both businesses and society, from mitigating the impact of climate change to empowering women and supporting people with disabilities (PwDs). The Chamber's first-ever Diversity and Inclusion Conference, held in December 2023 brought together various stakeholders actively engaged in promoting PwD inclusion in the workplace and society besides fostering diversity and ensuring equal opportunities to all.

Aligned with our goal to position Pakistan as a leading FDI destination, the OICCI remains pivotal in creating awareness and assisting policymakers

with insights from global best practices. The 2nd Pakistan Climate Conference (PCC) organised by OICCI on November 1, 2023, and our representation at COP28 in the UAE on December 9, 2023, exemplify our commitment to addressing critical challenges and policy issues related to climate

As part of our dedication to sustainability, the Chamber organized webinars dedicated to plastic recycling and reusability, envisioning a greener future through the dissemination of knowledge and best practices.

We extend our sincere gratitude to all OICCI members actively contributing to the compilation of this report. Special recognition goes to the Managing Committee, including Chairman of OICCI ESG Subcommittee Rehan M Shaikh, Co-Chairs of the ESG Subcommittee Ahmad Zahid Zaheer and Andrew Bailey, Social Core group members, and OICCI staff Sakina Chakera, and Dr. M. Nadeem Sarwar, whose pivotal roles have been instrumental in compiling this comprehensive report.





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Zero Hunger, SDG 2, aims to tackle hunger comprehensively by ensuring universal access to safe, nutritious, and sufficient food throughout the year. It prioritizes eradicating all forms of malnutrition, with specific targets for reducing stunting and wasting in children under 5 by 2025. Additionally, SDG 2 emphasizes doubling the productivity and incomes of small-scale food producers, promoting sustainable food production systems, and maintaining genetic diversity in seeds and cultivated plants. Investment in rural infrastructure, agricultural research, and market transparency are key strategies to achieve these goals.

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SDG 3, Good Health and Well Being, aims to enhance global health and well-being through a comprehensive set of targets. These include reducing the maternal mortality ratio to less than 70 per 100,000 live births and preventing newborn and child deaths, with a focus on neonatal mortality. The goal also addresses major epidemics such as AIDS, tuberculosis, and majoria, while promoting mental health. Efforts to combat substance abuse, road traffic accidents, and hazardous chemicals are integral to achieving SDG 3. Universal access to sexual and reproductive health care, along with financial risk protection and quality health services, is prioritized. Additionally, research and development for vaccines and medicines, health workforce strengthening, and early risk management play key roles in advancing global health.


























Sustainability at FCEPL

Key initiatives include installing solar-powered geysers, eco-friendly air conditioners, optimizing water usage through recovery efforts, installing solar panels at 64 farms and Milk Collection Centers, enhancing its logistics fleet efficiency, and reducing fuel consumption for a positive impact on the environment. July 2022 brought a story of tragedy to Pakistan, with widespread flooding inundating vital farmland and other important infrastructural areas. Illness began to spread quickly as disease-carrying mosquitos bred in standing water left behind from the flooding. Malaria and dengue fever took over in

the communities. To prevent diseases and respond to outbreaks, mosquito control measures were needed immediately.



Within a short time, BASF Pakistan team together with regional and global teams donated over 3,000 liters of Fendona® insecticide and around 23,000 Interceptor® mosquito nets to the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA).

Coordinated by the NDMA, the Interceptor mosquito nets and the Fendona sprays were distributed to multiple large cities in Sindh, the province that suffered some of the worst damage according to UN.

Beyond donations, part of our Stewardship commitment is that we ensure the proper and safe usage of our products. We ensured that the distributing authorities also had the complete education material for the safe use of the products.
